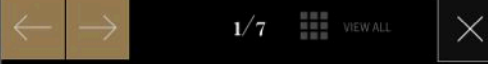




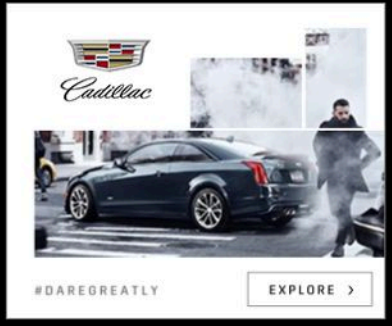

Zoe Buckman's Life Force

After the British artist Zoe Buckman had her first child in 2011—a daughter, Cleo—with her husband the actor David Schwimmer, a midwife told the artist that her placenta had depleted dangerously, that she had been close to losing the baby. It was a postpartum blow, but one that awoke an artistic inquiry into the organ that both gives life and takes it away. Buckman had her placenta cast in plastic, and since then has created a series of works—neon light sculptures, photographs of week-old flower arrangements wrapped in
